MAP's Solidarity Polyclinic is one of the few remaining lifelines in a healthcare system that has been systematically dismantled by the Israeli military. The clinic offers vital medical aid and comprehensive health services including physiotherapy and mental health care.

Asmaa, who facilitates mental health support at the Solidarity Polyclinic in Gaza, shares her experience:

"The children who come to see us are often deeply affected by the constant stress and anxiety of living in a warzone. Some also suffer from war-related injuries, including physical disabilities.

"Before the play therapy sessions at the clinic, many of the children are withdrawn and fearful, often hesitant to engage with others.

We give the children a safe space for them to express themselves through play, dancing, singing and drawing, and gradually they open up and show enthusiasm. Drawing allows them to express their feelings in a way that words often cannot."

"I have been coming to the physiotherapy here at MAP since November 2024. I have improved a lot since coming to the Polyclinic."

Rana*, aged 10



Rana*, aged 10, from northern Gaza has received over 60 physiotherapy sessions for her leg, which was severely injured by shrapnel. Thanks to these sessions, funded by your donations, Rana can now walk on her own.

More than one million refugees are living in camps and dilapidated shelters after Israel's military assault forced them to flee their homes. In 2024, MAP's WASH (water, sanitation and hygiene) programme became the **second-largest provider of safe drinking**

water to displacement camps.

IN GAZA

When the Israeli military ordered civilians in northern Gaza to evacuate to the south, Amany's husband, a paramedic, was killed. She had no choice but to flee with no financial support.

Amany explained, "Being displaced means there is no water. You can't wash your hands or clothes. You don't have clean water to drink and might have to drink dirty water, which can make you sick or even kill you."

With support from MAP, ShelterBox and our local partner the Social Development Forum, Amany received water through our daily water trucking activities.

PROTECTING MOTHERS AND CHILDREN

Palestinian refugees are excluded from accessing the Lebanese public health system, meaning MAP's community midwifery services in refugee camps here

MAP's adaptable, community-embedded approach ensures that mothers and children most at risk of harm continue to receive the care and support they need during times of crisis.

Following the escalation of Israel's attacks in September, the project swiftly adapted to meet the needs of midwifery teams mobilising to provide care in displacement shelters. These teams provide counselling for pregnant women, lactating mothers, and babies, as well as conducting group awareness

displaced women and children, with our sessions focused on nutrition, health and maintaining hygiene during emergencies.

EMERGENCY MEDICAL MISSIONS

Israel's attacks on Lebanon resulted in widespread destruction, thousands of casualties and mass displacement. This left families – including Palestinian refugees in camps across the country seeking protection in both formal and informal shelters. MAP responded with 10 emergency medical missions between October 2024 and March 2025.

BRINGING HEALTHCARE TO COMMUNITIES

IN THE WEST BANK

MAP's mobile clinic continued to bring critical primary healthcare services to marginalised communities in the West Bank, where access to basic services remains severely restricted. As escalating Israeli violence and settlement expansion deepened isolation, many communities became unable to reach health facilities in nearby towns or cities.

MARIAM'S STORY

Mariam relies on the mobile clinic to access essential care for her 17-year-old son. She explains, "The mobile clinic team has been incredibly supportive. My son, who has

a disability and is unable to walk or talk, receives regular home visits from them. They even provided him with a special bed, mattress and fan, which have greatly improved his comfort and wellbeing."
